EVA KMENTOVÁ ART WORK DIARY

The press conference will take place on the 4th of December, 2006, at 4, 00 p.m. in the Mánes

Exhibition Hall. The exhibition itself will be opened on the 4th of December at 6.00 p.m. by Ludmila

Vachtová, who conceived and planned the exhibition.

The sculptor Eva Kmentová (1928–1980), a graduate of the Prague Higher School of Decorative

Arts and a member of the former Trasa (Track) Group, was one of the key protagonists of Czech

art in the latter half of the 20th century. With her use of a wide range of unconventional materials

she advanced the frontiers of the classical concept of sculpture into new areas, transcending the

rules of formal aesthetics. Her spatial realisations in concrete and plaster and her work on paper

remain bewitchingly urgent and immediate in their appeal to life even after more than a quarter of a

century. The publishing house Arbor vitae is marking the occasion of the retrospective exhibition by

publishing a monograph entitled Now: the Work of Eva Kmentová by Ludmila Vachtová and Polana

Bregantová.

The exhibition is being held under the aegis of the Mayor of Prague, Pavel Bém, and is organised

by the Czech Fund for the Arts and the Arbor Vitae publishing house in co-operation with Eva

Kmentová's family.

NOW. The Work of Eva Kmentová

The publishing house Arbor vitae has published a book entitled NOW. The Work of Eva Kmentová

to go with the present exhibition. Eva Kmentová was entirely absorbed in the present and reacted

with immediacy to the stimuli of the contemporary, which is why the book is entitled NOW. From

her adolescence to her death she wrote a diary in which she commented on her work, which is why

the catalogue of her art in the book and the exhibition at Mánes is entitled Art Work Diary.

The work of Eva Kmentová is structured biographically and with topographical reference to the

three studios in which she worked: Židovské pece, later the "Den" in Kalininova Street in Žižkov,

and finally the Stodola (Barn) in Smíchov.

The book includes the Biographical Album with commentary, Olbram Zoubek's memoir on the

atelier he shared with his wife, and a three-art essay by Ludmila Vachtová. The thematic core and

centre of gravity of the publication is the Art Work Diary, a complete, illustrated catalogue of 612

accessible works from the years 1951-1979, drawn up by Polana Bregantová. Selected texts by

Eva Kmentová – among them several not previously unpublished – form a natural transition to the

documentary section.

The individual themes are arranged in three major, chronologically structured blocks of

illustrations. The graphic design of the book, the work of Helena Šantavá, enhances this

conception and enables readers to appreciate it on three different levels according to taste and

interest:

1. Academically and with an eye to professional usefulness for bibliographically orientated

scholars, exhibition curators, art history publicists, museum staff and collectors,

2. Associatively for those who want to develop or create their own idea of the intensity of Czech art

in the latter half of the 20th century, and of one of its key protagonists,

3. Purely visually for those who just like unconventional art works.
